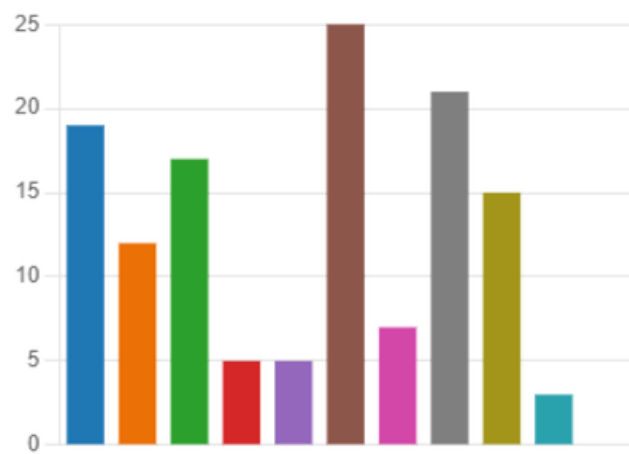

Why districts use CDE:

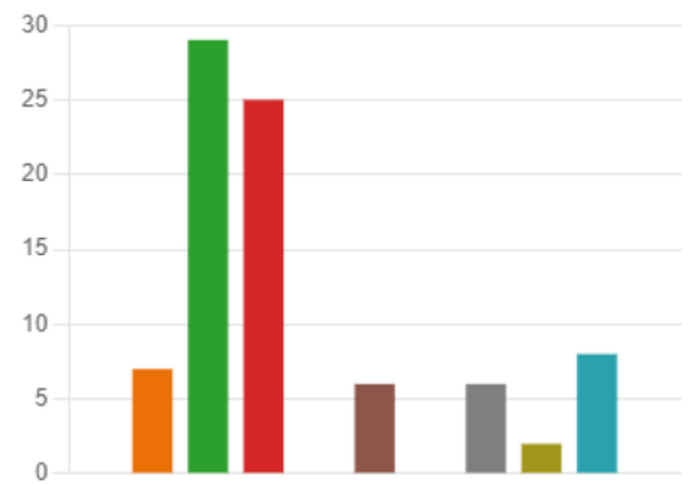
62.5% of respondents use CDE because of its wide variety of courses.

Which services are most used?

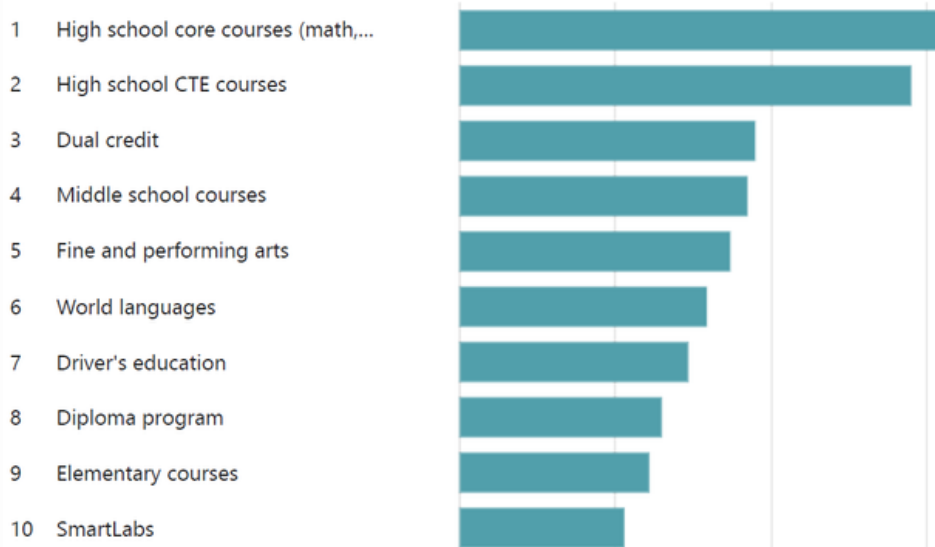
High school core courses and CTE courses are CDE's most in-demand services.
